

UPDATE ON TREE WORK IN THE PARK: 7 JULY 2011

Regular users of the Park will have noticed that work on the trees has begun. This is exclusively work for which permission has been granted by the Isle of Wight Council for reasons of public safety – and as you can see below, some of the work is long overdue.

These photos show the remains of the beech tree (reference 1422) which used to stand by the path from Ward Avenue towards the Community Hall. As you can see, the interior of the tree is almost completely hollow and constituted a serious risk to public safety.



The holm oak on the same path (reference 1420) has also been felled: here is a picture of the remains, once again showing the rot and disease inside the trunk.



And here is a picture of the remains of the diseased holm oak (reference 1388) alongside the church wall.
