
NORTHWOOD HOUSE NEWSLETTER

THE ISLE OF WIGHT LITERARY FESTIVAL 13th - 16th October, 2016

Now in its 5th year The Isle of Wight Literary Festival is an annual event based at Northwood House.

This year's line-up is exciting with a wide ranging cast of over 60 local and international speakers covering a diverse range of topics from history, music, poetry, travel, theatre, politics, espionage, fiction, architecture through to medicine and nature.

In addition, the Festival has a vibrant youth programme and an expanded jazz programme featuring the Gary Plumley and Nick Page Quartet on Thursday, award winning jazz singer Liane Carroll on Friday and Cat Skellington on Saturday.

Speakers at the festival this year include:

The Incomplete Shakespeare – John Crace and John Sutherland provide an abbreviated version Shakespeare's greatest plays in witty rhyming couplets.

A N Wilson provides highlights from "Victoria: A Life" his definitive biography of Queen Victoria. He also talks about his new novel "Resolution" about George

Forster – a botanist who travelled with Captain Cook to the southern hemisphere.



Alan Titchmarsh discusses his latest novel Mr Gandy's Grand Tour with Stephanie Cross.

Dr Jo Marchant investigates the power of

mind over body, delving in to the latest scientific research and the influence of thoughts beliefs and emotions on our physical health.

Other speakers include **Alan Johnson MP** talking about his



political career, Rosa Prince and Dr James D Boys discussing Hillary Clinton and Jeremy Corbyn, Michael Portillo speaking about his "life of two halves", eminent Shakespearean actor Michael Pennington recalling playing King Lear in Brooklyn, and our own Tim Wander.
