

Contains themes of ghosts and legends portrayed by actors and story tellers around Northwood House aimed at parents with children.

Please note this is a fun and mildly educational experience and contains no attempt to scare or frighten any attendees as part of the experience, although the nature of the darkened venue and the "ghostly themes" covered are intended to add to the atmosphere of the proceedings.


Doors open 5.30pm / Tour time 6 - 7.15pm approx with tea, coffee & squash on arrival

Apparently the House is home to hundreds of ghosts and the scene of countless paranormal incidents. For more than a century, people have believed this is due to the myriad of leylines that run beneath the Island's landscape, beneath our very feet. These ancient lines create powerful magnetic forces which, it has long been claimed, are directly responsible for increases in supernatural energy and paranormal activity.

Whatever you might believe, you are invited to join our experienced crew and immerse

yourselves in the deep history of this much loved, yet much troubled ancient building.



With tea, coffee and biscuits on arrival (included in your ticket price), your experience will begin with a briefing from our paranormal experts before the lights are extinguished and the investigation begins. In near-total darkness you will be escorted around this Grade II\* listed building, taking in three floors including the cellars, narrow, winding staircases and even a library that was once used as a morgue. Using professional ghost hunting equipment - including EMF meters, video cameras, infra-red thermal scanners, EVP sound recorders and motion detectors, who knows what you might experience?

All we know is this: these investigations are not for the faint-hearted and aimed at for those who believe in paranormal activity and the existence of the spirit world...or at least are open minded enough to find out more. If you've had a previous experience or an interaction with the spirit world or seen even a ghost, please let our experts know upon arrival.

Join us on the night after Halloween for a spooky evening tour featuring ghost stories, myths, legends and supernatural tales associated with Northwood House, the Island's most haunted venue. This is far more than just a ghost walk though - it's a chance to unravel the history of the house and to find out why this rambling Georgian manor maybe so haunted as you tour the many rooms and passageways at night by candlelight.

Tim Wander, author of the popular local book "Ghosts of Northwood House" will be your host and guide for the evening which will start with an introduction in the House Ballroom, followed by a tour through the venue which will take you

through dark cellars and eerie old servants quarters where the public don't normally have access.

With its fascinating history as a red cross hospital, convent and Spanish flu morgue, it's no wonder Northwood House may have more than its fair share of opportunities to acquire some spiritual residents over its 200 year history. Tim will reveal some of the ghostly sightings and unexplained occurrences that have taken place in the venue, so if you are fascinated in ghosts, this is an evening not to be missed!

Sorry, this event is for adults over 16 years old only.

Meet in the Licensed House Bar from 7:00pm for a 7:45pm start. Get a drink to settle your nerves!

This exclusive tour of the house is by candlelight and through darkened rooms, so guests will need to take extra care while moving through the building. Those of a nervous disposition should only attend the event if accompanied by another person.

Narrow stairs will be used to access the cellars and first floor of the building, so some parts of the experience will not be suitable/accessible for those with walking difficulties or needing a wheelchair for which we apologise in advance.

Free parking is available in the rotunda car park, with entrance through the main rotunda doors.

Tim has been helping with the post production history side and has sent historic notes and photographs and even drone footage taken during the recent rotunda renovations.
